Mid-Summer Report...

On behalf of the Kreative Kidz staff I would like to commend all our participants on their behavior and enthusiasm shown during the first half of summer camp.

Our first few weeks focused on how to be a part of a TEAM. The teams worked on team challenges, logic building skills, "HoopLa", "Cup Stack". Additional team challenges will include "Bucket Balance", "Spider Web", Water Tug-A-War, and "Mine Fields".

We also challenged our participants with "new grade level prep" introducing a variety of science and math concepts, financial concepts and brain-balance puzzles along with creative writing and lower level grade teaching. Participants have been introduced to game and application design and coding via Tynker and Kodable.com and are now refining their logical skills weekly during "Web Wednesdays".

We visited Score Indoor for our Kickball League and team challenges at Wilkerson Mill Park. On movie day we went to Fayetteville to watch "The Secret Life of Pets". We've gone to Carl Miller Park to cool off in the fountains and we'll go swimming at Peachtree City Aquatic Center. In the next few weeks we will be working robots and drones, playing Dodgeball at Score Indoor, more team challenges, and celebrating the end of summer camp with a picnic.

Our STEM Camp participants have embarked on adventures to West Point Lake in Georgia to learn about hydropower and water safety, visited a landfill to learn the process of waste management, toured a water treatment plant, and the National Weather Service. They have also suited up for "Mission Quest" at the Museum of Aviation in Warner Robbins and learned how to manage flight paths for airplanes via flight simulators. Moving forward, STEM Camp participants will put on their lab coats and transform into scientists while studying chemical reactions and a variety of other interesting scientific concepts, visit the Tellus Science Center for "Rockin' Geology", be introduced to the world of orienteering (field navigation and mapping), game design and coding and robotics.

Amidst all the adventures we've sprinkled in some great learning concepts and ideas where our participants took on challenges to learn and grow and prepare them for their new school year. We hope all will come away from summer camp "enriched", "educated", "empowered", and "encouraged"!

There are many more fun-filled activities to enjoy so keep up the "GOOD WORK"!

What's The Issue...?

Prevent Bullying (at School or Elsewhere)...


Listed below are tips for students to prevent bullying:

1. If bullied, tell a parent, teacher, or administrator. In the instance of bullying, telling is not "tattling" or "snitching". It is a safety measure that can save someone's life.
2. Do not retaliate or get angry. This may result in bad decisions. Stay calm and seek help from adults.
3. If approached by a bully, respond evenly and firmly or say nothing and walk away.
4. Develop friendships and stick up for each other.
5. Take a different route to and from school.
6. Avoid unsupervised areas of school.
7. Do not bring expensive items to school.
8. Submit a written notice with date, time, and summary of the bullying incident to the principal and counselor, or administrator.
9. If you witness bullying in or out of school, tell a parent, school administrator, or local authorities as soon as possible.
10. If bullying continues without help from parents or school administrators, please contact your local Board of Education and/or Superintendent's office.
